Five common mistakes businesses make when implementing ISO 45001:

Lack of Management Commitment

Management must lead by example and provide the necessary resources to implement and maintain an effective occupational health and safety management system.

Poor Documentation

Documentation is essential to ensure that processes are being followed consistently, and it also provides evidence of compliance.

Ineffective Training

Inadequate or ineffective training can result in employees not fully understanding their roles and responsibilities in relation to the occupational health and safety management system. This can lead to noncompliance and a lack of understanding of the importance of safety measures.

Failure to Involve Employees:

Businesses that fail to involve employees in the development and implementation of the occupational health and safety management system can miss out on valuable insights and feedback. Employees are often the most knowledgeable about workplace hazards and can provide suggestions for improvement.

Lack of Continual Improvement

Businesses that fail to monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the occupational health and safety management system and take action to address any deficiencies may miss out on opportunities for improvement and risk stagnating or falling behind in safety performance.



What is ISO?

ISO (International Organisation for Standardisation) develops global standards, and ISO 45001 specifically focuses on occupational health and safety management systems.

What is the ISO 45001 pathway?

The pathway involves understanding the standard, conducting a gap analysis, implementing an OHSMS, and completing certification audits.

What does ISO 45001 certification entail?

Certification requires aligning your organisation's health and safety processes with ISO 45001 standards and passing an external audit by an accredited certification body.

How long should it take?

Depending on the organisation's size and readiness, certification can typically take 6 to 12 months.

How much does it cost?

Costs vary based on factors like organisational size and consultant fees, but budgets typically range from a few thousand to tens of thousands of dollars.

Do we have to be certified?

No, certification is voluntary, but adopting ISO 45001 can demonstrate a commitment to health and safety and provide various benefits. We recommend all businesses aim to align their health and safety management system to the ISO 45001 framework as a minimum.
